Although females were not admitted to the ranks of active lifesaving until 1981, I played a role in fund-raising and public relations since my introduction to North Caloundra Surf Lifesaving Club (now Dicky Beach SLSC) in 1969.

In 1982, I was instrumental in the establishment of Nippers at North Caloundra, and held the positions of Branch Delegate(3 years), Secretary(3 years), and Chairperson (4 years).

I gained my bronze medallion in 1984, and performed active patrols for the next 11 years. I was Secretary of the Supporters Club for 7 years, and currently hold the positions of Clubhouse Director and Deputy President.

I was made a Paul Harris Fellow by The Rotary Foundation of Rotary International in recognition of my service to the community through surf lifesaving, and was also awarded a Frontline Leadership Award by Queensland Surf Lifesaving in 2004.

I was honored with Life Membership of Dicky Beach Surf Lifesaving Club in 1996. It is my vision that Dicky Beach SLSC maintain its proud boast of '*No lives lost between the red and yellow flags*', and that we continue to provide all the opportunities that surf lifesaving offers to our members, be it surf sport, administration, education or service to the community.
